Objective	Clinical Exam: Appearance of skin pigmentation is even and consistent, slightly pink-tan, and warm to touch equal bilaterally. Skin is dry with a smooth texture and turgor is normal for age. No edema, jaundice appearance, or erythema noted. Four small cherry angiomas noted to chest area. Angioma #1 red appearance, measuring 1.5mm, blanchable, located on right infraclavicular region. Angioma # 2 red in appearance, measuring 1mm, blanchable, located on right infraclavicular region below angioma #1. Angioma #3 red in appearance, measuring 2mm, blanchable, located on upper sternal area. Angioma #4 red in appearance, measuring 1.5mm, blanchable located on left infraclavicular region. No other presence of lesions on chest. Two non-pus-filled pustules noted to right shoulder and one non pus-filled pustule to left shoulder. All three pustules blanchable. Scarring noted to both shoulders. Hair: Distribution even, thin texture, brown hair with no grey, lesions, or pest inhabitants. Nails: Nail beds pink with instant capillary refill with no clubbing or deformities noted. Education: Education provide to patient to use the ABCDEF rule when assessing skin for any abnormal areas.
